## **PART I GENERAL PRESENTATION OF ULK**

### **I.1. PRELIMINARIES**

#### **I.1.1. Foundation and agreement**

Kigali Independent University (ULK) is a higher learning institution. It was created on 15<sup>th</sup> March 1996 and accredited by the convention no 001/98 of 02/02/1998 with the Government of the Republic of Rwanda. ULK got its own status by the Ministerial Order No 013/17 of June 07, 2002.

### **I.1.2. Vision**

ULK is destined to stand out as a remarkable university for excellence at the heart of Africa with highly motivated students and high qualified personnel endowed with elevated ethic values. ULK also takes pride in its very modern infrastructures and equipments and endeavours to perfectly fulfil its mission before God.

### **I.1.3. Mission**

ULK fundamental mission is to provide the people with a training which enable them to become actors and organizers of a complete development of our nation. In this respect, research work is basically focused on topics of local, national and regional interests.

### **I.1.4. Objectives**

- Serving the community.

## **I.2. ORGANIZATION OF THE UNIVERSITY**

### **I.2.1. Organs**

The university organs are:

- The office of the Founder and President of ULK;
- The Board of Directors;
- The Academic Senate;
- The Executive Council;
- The Faculty Council;
- The Department Council.

The organization and functioning of most of the above listed organs are provisioned by the law n° 20/2005 of 20/10/2005 governing the Organization and Functioning of Higher Education Institutions in Rwanda as well as ULK Internal Regulations.

### **I.2.2. Faculties and Centres**

Kigali Independent University (ULK) runs four faculties in Kigali Campus and three faculties in Gisenyi Campus. These are: the Faculty of Economics and Business Studies; The Faculty of Social Sciences and the Faculty of Law, in both campuses, as well as the Faculty of Science and Technology in Kigali Campus.

ULK also runs a Centre of Languages (CELA) which conducts the teaching of the English Language to both members of the ULK Staff as well as to students. The staff employed in the CELA are qualified and competent. The Centre is also equipped with audio-visual materials as well as different levels teaching and leisure reading books, newspapers, magazines, CD-Roms, etc.

Kigali Independent University (ULK) teaching system is focused upon providing fundamental knowledge and skills for professionalization. In this regard, ULK has set up four Computer Laboratories in Kigali Campus and two computer laboratories in Gisenyi Campus, where students are trained in new technologies of information and communication. These laboratories have 1149 computers. ICT skills are taught in each and every class (including the 500 brand-new computers acquired for the Digital Library).

The available internet connection allows the university community to carry out free of charge, research, documentation as well as exchange with the rest of the world, particularly into its four digital library laboratories located in Kigali Campus. All offices computers are also connected to internet.

## **PART II. KEY ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE 2011-2012 ACADEMIC YEAR**

## **II.1. Teaching**

### **II.1.1. Modules (units), examinations and dissertations running**

In teaching, all the courses planned in the 2011-2012 academic year were carried out and the new academic year 2012-2013 started on 04<sup>th</sup> September 2012. The first and second sitting (sessions) of examinations were all carried out, as well as claiming letters related to, processed. Dissertations have also been presented up to the 31<sup>st</sup> December 2012.

As far as postgraduate studies are concerned, the key milestone of the academic year was the approval by the Ministry of Education, through its letter N°4176/1200/2012 dated 13/07/2012, of the nine master's degrees proposed by ULK. These postgraduate studies schemes are the following:

- Master's Degree in Finance;
- Master's Degree in Accounting;
- Master's Degree in Development Studies;
- Master's Degree in Governance;
- Master's Degree in Information Systems;
- Master's Degree in Business Administration;
- Master's Degree in International Economic Law and Business Law;
- Master's Degree in Public International Law;

### **II.1.2. Academic staff**

The statement of the academic staff members for the year 2011-2012 as compared to the past two years is as follows:

In 2011 ULK had the total number of **327** Academic staff among whom **2** Full Professors, **7** Associate Professors, **31** Senior Lecturers, **274** Lecturers and **13** Assistant Lecturers.

As far as the academic staff training is concerned, **27 lecturers** are being trained in PhD, and **many** others in master's degrees. **2** lecturers presented their PhD thesis in 2012.

Concerning the advancement of grades, **two lecturers** have been promoted as Senior Lecturer and **one** as Associate Professor.

### II.1.3. Students

The figure of ULK registered students in 2011-2012 amounted to 11 820 students of whom 8 666 at the Kigali campus and 3 154 at the campus of Gisenyi. Compared with the academic year 2010-2011, the figure of students has decreased of 381 units. Out of 8 666 students at the campus of Kigali, 3 254 (37.5%) are male and 3 412 (62.5%) are female, whereas at Gisenyi Campus, proportions are 1 597 (50.6%) for male and 1649 (52%) for female.

An attached appendix shows the figure of students and their academic performance.

#### II.1.4. Academic graduation

During the academic year 2011-2012, ULK graduation ceremonies which took place both in Kigali Campus and in Gisenyi campus conferred bachelor's degrees to 2 139 graduands in Kigali Campus and 689 in Gisenyi Campus.

#### II.1.5. Library

In 2011-2012, the Kigali Independent University- Kigali Campus Library had 55 074, while the Gisenyi Campus had 20 806 volumes. ULK bought or acquired 4 500 volumes in 2011-2012 while the purchase and acquisition was of 3 873 in 2010-2011. A Digital

Library with 500 new computers, with access to different publishers of e-books and e-journals has also been put in place, thus making a total of 1170 computers for all ULK Computer laboratories.

## **II.2. Research and Consultancy**

As far as research is concerned, the University Scientific journal published 4 issues in 2011-2012, issues 23, 24, 25 and 26; all with a total of 14 articles. ULK has also hosted and has participated to various scientific *fora* in 2011-2013; some of them are listed under the heading “services to the community”.

## **II.3. Cooperation**

In the field of cooperation, ULK signed MoUs with:

ULK has been represented to various regional academic fora by top academic managers, namely:

- The Rector, Dr SEKIBIBI Ezechiel: in the IUCEA Meeting in Kampala;
- The Vice-Rector Academics, Gisenyi Campus, Dr CYEZE Emmanuel: in the RIGL meeting in Kinshasa;
- The Vice-Rector Research and Postgraduate Studies, Dr KASAI Ndahiriwe: in the IUCEA meeting in Dar-Es-Salaam.

In the Rwandan Association of Private Institutions of Higher Learning (ARIPES), ULK was involved in many activities organized by ARIPES, including: the organizing of a *Summary of the 2011-2012 Annual Report- The Sixteenth Year Book*

colloquium ; tournament among all institutions, where ULK came up the first in three disciplines: football, volley-ball and basket-ball.

The university has also participated in all meetings of ARIPES as well as these of the Council of Rectors of Private Institutions of Higher Learning (CRIPES).

As for Sports and Culture, ULK won three medals into the ARIPES tournament, respectively in: Football, Volley-ball and Basket-ball.

The university has also received two awards: the RRA best contributor award as well an award from the Forum of Print News Paper (FPN), it awarded ULK for its outstanding support in 2011.

#### **II.4. Service to the community**

In the field of service to the community, the University was involved in several activities of national and international interest (judicial clinic, holding out seminars, organizing and participating to different conferences and symposiums. The following are to be noted:

- 26<sup>th</sup> January 2012, ULK hosted a conference on “upholding Heroism through protecting children against any abuse; animated by Hon. Protais Mitali (Minister of Youth and ICT); Hon. Ndayisaba Fidele (Mayor of Kigali) and Lt. General Ceasar Kaisari
- On 16<sup>th</sup> February 2012 ULK welcomed the Minister of Education Dr. Vincent Biruta amid ARIPES General Assembly at Host;
- On the 1<sup>st</sup> March 2012 the institution held Accountability Day and a Press Conference to present to its customers and public a large its services and products;

- On 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2012, the Rwanda Governance Board launched the Governance Month at ULK, a poll opinions from ULK community regarding the role of academia in consolidating good governance in Rwanda;
- 24<sup>th</sup> April 2012, New Development on International Humanitarian Law by Sarah Schwart;
- Various students' career development clubs have been initiated and launched with a clear aim to improve professionalism and employability among students: 4<sup>th</sup> may 2012; Official Launch of CEE the investment Club by Prof. Rugege Geoffrey;
- 10<sup>th</sup> May 2012, Learning from History Building a Better Future by Lt. Gen. Charles KAYONGA and Mr. KAREMERA Ildephonse
- On the 19<sup>th</sup> June 2012 East Africa Consortium of University Entrepreneurs was launched by Mr Tobias Hugh.
- On 21<sup>st</sup> June 2011 ULK hosted a conference prior to the celebration of the 50 years anniversary of independence. The key address was centered on the theme: The Unity of Rwandans should be the Pillar of true independence with Hon. Fatuma NDANGIZA and Maj. Gen. MUSEMAKWELI Jacques as speakers;
- ULK contributed to the Agaciro development Fund with an amount of Rwf 113,000,000; raised from both the institution and its employees.
- On the 10<sup>th</sup> June 2012 ULK was crowned the ARIPES Champion after winning three trophies from football, Basketball and Volleyball tournaments;
- On 5<sup>th</sup> September 2012 ULK was awarded by RRA among best taxes payers for social development;
- 24<sup>th</sup> September 2012 ULK Officially launched its Masters programmes with nine specialties;

- From 8<sup>th</sup> December 2012 to 18<sup>th</sup> December ULK Showcased its contribution to country development in prosperity organized at the occasion of celebration 25 years of transformational leadership of RPF; Etc.
- FRB assisted 2 435 students so far in 2011 without mentioning 404 for this academic year.

## **II.5. Administration and Finance**

The following summary of the administration and finance report comprises a highlight upon the organizational structure of ULK as well as heading on administration activities, organs meetings, etc.

As for the organizational structure, in 2011-2012, all the organs listed in the law bearing the organization and the functioning of higher education institutions as well as in the university regulations have functioned regularly, these organs are:

In 2011-2012, the University administration comprised the Rector, 5 Vice- Rectors (Kigali and Gisenyi), 7 Deans of whom 4 in Kigali and 3 in Gisenyi; 11 Directors and 13 Heads of Departments for both campuses. Different services worked under the authority of the above mentioned managers.

In order to better achieve its mission, several meetings were held:

- Board of Directors: one meeting per term ( 3 meetings were held );
- Academic Senate: one meeting every two months ( over 10 meetings were held , including extraordinary meetings );
- Executive Council: One meeting every two weeks ( about 30 meetings were held per Campus including extraordinary meetings );
- Faculty Council: once a month ( Almost all the faculties respected the regularity of meetings );
- Department Council (meeting were held according to circumstances).

Administrative meetings with students and staff members were also organized. Apart from organs activities, other administrative activities were carried out by different managers of the University. As for the finance, key data to present are as follows:

## II.6. Infrastructure

In 2011-2013, ULK/Kigali is endowed with adequate infrastructure and equipment. From January 2007 all the ULK faculties and administration operate in the new Campus premises at Gisozi. These premises include three faculties and laboratories buildings;

a new Main Building sheltering the main administration offices, the digital library and the masters programmes lecture rooms, etc; a large stadium with almost 14,000 places holding capacity.
